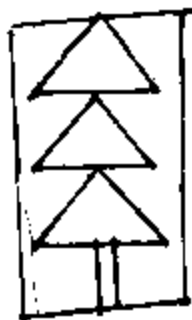


Flying Geese Tree Block

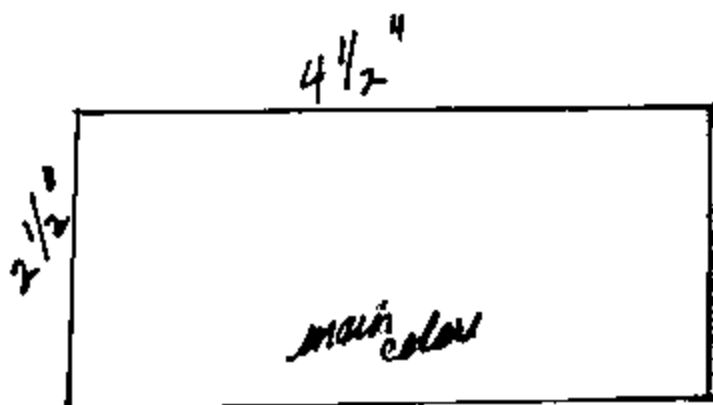

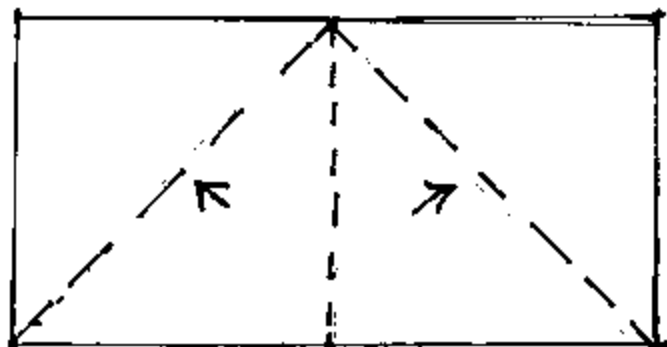
(Hope yours isn't

Block $8\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

Use $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle
of main color



Background: Cut 2- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " sq. and
sew onto ends of
rectangle with diagonal
seam - fold back bottom
part of square up against
seam - press - may trim
from behind - repeat
with other square.

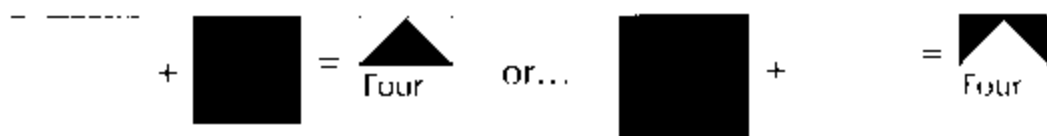

Making Your Flying Geese Patches

Flying Geese Patches are constructed by first cutting and sewing two different sizes of squares. Follow the values shown below to get the Geese Patches you want.



To make the 4" x 8" finished geese patch, cut the larger square 11" and the smaller square 9½".

To make the 2" x 4" finished geese patch, cut the larger square 7" and the smaller square 5½".
